10 THUGS HIJACK BUS!

WE'VE all heard about thugs hijack in cars . . .

But now Cape Town thugs have come up with a new idea – they hijacked a bus!

The Golden Arrow bus was almost full when 10 men got on board at the Wynberg bus stop on Friday afternoon.

They paid for their tickets in cash and looked like normal passengers.

The bus was bound for Khayelitsha and most of the passengers were schoolkids. Suddenly, in Lansdowne Road near Gugulethu, all 10 men stood up at once and

pulled out their weapons!

They threatened passengers with pistols, a Taser shock gun and knives.

"Give us your cellphones and money," the thugs shouted.

Fearing for their lives, most of the passengers handed over their belongings.

A man (30), who tried to fight off the thugs was stabbed and shot in his left arm, and a 17-year-old pupil broke his left leg when he jumped through a window of the moving bus!

The traumatised bus driver, who didn't want to give his name, told *Daily Sun*: "I

was shocked when I heard screams in the bus. I wanted to drive straight to the police station, but the passengers begged me to stop. They thought driving to the cops would make the thugs angry. So I stopped and the thugs jumped out and ran away with their loot."

A passenger, [REDACTED] (17), said people who refused to hand over their belongings were shocked with the Taser gun.

Police spokeswoman Captain Ntomboxolo Sitshitshi confirmed the incident.

"I believed what he said, although on my way to their room, I thought I heard Mlungisi crying that his brother was killing him."

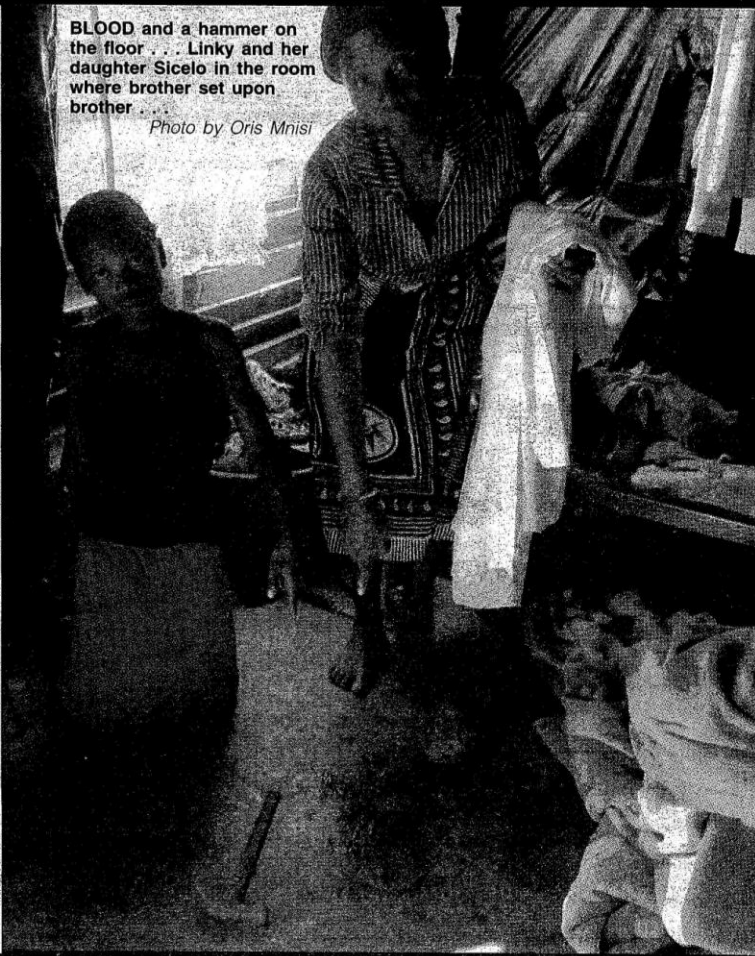
The mum left her daughter in the room and rushed out to look for help.

Now it's alleged that the little girl watched as January pulled out a bloodied hammer from under the bed and smashed his brother's head repeatedly!
