

PUPILS NOT SAFE AT SCHOOL

Teacher burns kids with knife

Their parents sent them to school because they thought it would be safe there – but two of them were taken to a doctor yesterday with bruises and burn marks.
And they are not the only ones

who have been hurt at the school.

At least 15 Grade 2 pupils from Letsema Ilima Primary School in Evaton in the Vaal have laid charges of assault with intent to do grievous bodily harm against a

do grievous boaily harm against a female teacher.

Principal Tom Morajane says he knows of more than 19 reported incidents of children being assaulted with an assortment of instruments, including stones, by

the teacher.

The children suffered burn wounds after she put a knife in the heater and branded their faces and hands on Friday.

Their crime was failing to give the right answers during a maths

A pupil said: "We could not figure out maths sums so the teacher put a knife in the heater and used it to burn our faces and hands. This is not the first time she has punished us.

"Most of the time she throws stones at us, pours hot tea over us and pokes us with needles."
The child's mother said: "What

makes us angry is that our chil-dren are unsafe at school." Yesterday she opened a case of assault against the teacher. Another child told Sowetan: "I

was scared to tell my parents that the teacher was beating us.

"She sometimes uses a pipe."
The teacher is now on the run
and did not report for duty yes-

terday.

Police said yesterday that they had raided her home last Friday but did not find her.

Sowetan also learnt that the Emfuleni district education office has since charged her with misconduct and she is expected to respond to the charges within 48

Democratic Alliance spokes-man Hermene Koorts said: "This kind of violence against learners cannot be tolerated

"The teacher has to be expelled immediately and unions must not get involved. We must always

It was only when 23 pupils arrived home with burn marks last Friday that parents decided to take action.


This time the teacher allegedly branded the kids with a hot knife.

He said when the knife got hot, she placed it against his cheeks.

Angry parents approached the principal and on Sunday a meeting was held where parents demanded that the teacher be re-




moved. Parents have reported the matter to the police. The teacher has since disappeared.

Democratic Alliance councillor Daddy Mollo said the principal had written a report and the teacher had been given 48 hours to respond.
